RE: Proposed Amendment to Region C Water Plan

The North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) has recently finalized negotiations for its East Fork Reuse Project - a man made wetlands to be constructed near Seagoville, Texas on the East Fork of the Trinity River. After receiving the required State and Federal permits and completion of the required diversion and wetlands construction, water will be processed through the wetlands and transported to Lake Lavon to augment NTMWD's raw water supply.

The 2001 Region C Water Plan (Plan) does not specifically reference the East Fork Reuse Project in the NTMWD Recommended Water Management Strategies, although as you know reuse is a water management strategy identified in the Plan to help address the region's water supply needs. However, in order to ensure that no claim can be made that the East Fork Reuse Project is "inconsistent with the Plan," NTMWD would like the Plan amended to make specific reference to this project.

The population and demand projections gathered by the Region C consultants are evidence that NTMWD's water needs are going to exceed its current supplies, unless additional raw water sources are developed. Please accept this letter as a request, pursuant to the Texas Water Development Board's *Procedures for Amending an Approved Regional Water Plan*, to amend the Region C Water Plan to make specific reference to the East Fork Reuse Project as a selected water management strategy to meet the needs of NTMWD and its members and customers.
